





My Brothers All,

We have completed the Food for Families Program via our donations to local food banks ... \$500 to Our Daily Bread, and \$200 to Coventry Food Bank.

We are actively working towards completion of the Consecration of the Holy Family Program ... Hand out brochures and prayer cards have been ordered and received. My focus is on the OLC AND SVDP Parishes as they are the most receptive given the COVID-19 limitations. My proposal is now being reviewed by Father Jacek ... Includes brochure and prayer card distribution to parishioners, bulletin & verbal altar announcements on Dec. 19 & 20, and recitation of the Consecration Prayer by Father Jacek on Dec. 26 & 27 ... The feast of the Holy Family.

I'm formulating plans for the Good Friday Family Promotion ... Prayer Cards have been ordered and received, and my plan is to invite families from all 4 associated parishes to attend the "Living Stations of the Cross" which is usually performed at OLC on Wednesday evening (3/31) just before Good Friday (4/2). I will focus more on this after Christmas, and a lot of my planning will depend on where we are at with regard to COVID-19 limitations at that time.
