
Continue to pray for all those suffering from COVID-19 and for all caregivers that they may be sustained by the grace of God in all that they do.

My Brothers All,

The “Food for Families” Program (a featured Program), and the “Consecration to the Holy Family” Program, are now both complete. Currently, I am working towards the completion of the “Preparation for Good Friday” Program. Good Friday is celebrated on April 2nd this year. Unfortunately, many of the suggested “face to face” preparation activities pertaining to this program could not be accomplished due to COVID-19 restrictions, but I/we have been able to do other things that hopefully will motivate individuals & families to participate in the Good Friday Services at each of the Parishes that our Council is associated with. Firstly, a schedule of Good Friday Stations of the Cross, and Good Friday Evening Services was sent out to all Knights via global email. Secondly, a special KofC “Prayer for all Persecuted Christians” will be published in each Parish Bulletin at least once during Lent. Lastly, beginning Sunday, March 7th, Parishioners will find the following KofC supplied items at the entrances to all 4 associate Churches ... During his tenure as Grand Knight, Brother Bill saw the creation of our Squires program, and was incredibly supportive of the program.

On March 1, 2021, Patrick Kelly begins his tenure as the Order's 14th Supreme Knight, leading the Knight of Columbus around the world in our mission of charity, unity and fraternity. He has had a distinguished career in the Knights of Columbus, the military and public service. For more than 25 years, he has a demonstrated track record of service to Church and country, which serves him well in advancing the Knights' mission of Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism.

Mr. Kelly has served as Deputy Supreme Knight since 2017. Prior to that, he served as Vice President for Public Policy for 11 years, spearheading the Knights' interaction with the White House, Congress and federal agencies. He has also served as State Deputy in the District of Columbia. As a longtime executive and fraternal leader of the Knights of Columbus, he has consistently strengthened its record of charity, advocacy, insurance, investment and membership growth.

Mr. Kelly served as the first executive director of the Saint John Paul II National Shrine in Washington, D.C., and oversaw the renewal of the facility after its purchase by the Knights in 2011. During his tenure, the shrine became a leading pilgrimage site and a source of education and inspiration for Catholics throughout the United States and the world.

He and his wife, Vanessa, have three daughters. They live in Connecticut.

March 2021**


At the Last Supper, Jesus gave us the gift of himself in the Eucharist, our essential spiritual food and drink, which gives us the life of Christ. We live at a time when many Catholics do not believe in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist — the body, blood, soul and divinity of Christ under the appearances of bread and wine. May we, brother Knights, never forget the true nature of the Eucharist nor lose our desire to receive Christ in the sacrament of the altar.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori: This month, I challenge you to spend 10 additional minutes each Sunday before Mass preparing to receive the Eucharist and 10 minutes after Mass in thanksgiving for this gift. Second, I challenge you to assist your brother Knights in the Faith in Action Sacramental Gifts program to help your fellow parishioners understand the great gifts of the sacraments.

Questions for Reflection: Do you examine your conscience before receiving holy Communion and go to confession first, if necessary? Do you show reverence for Christ in the Eucharist in such a way that you witness to the Real Presence to your family and fellow parishioners? During the consecration, are you attentive to the mystery taking place at the altar?
